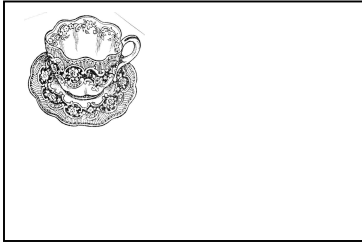

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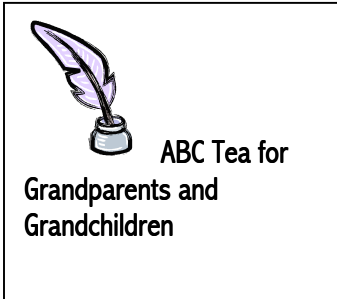

### TEA TIME

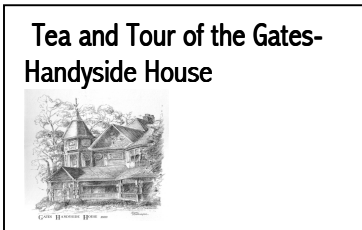


Two teas are planned by Lynn Jones and the Victorian Maids. Each tea is limited to 40 guests so that everyone receives special attention and service.
